CARPENTER

<u>Definition:</u> A carpenter is defined as a craftsman with a skill and experience level greater than a helper or laborer, but less than a lead or foreman carpenter. The carpenter will generally have a smaller tool inventory and may need direction to perform more advanced carpentry skills.

Knowledge

Knowledge of residential construction and remodeling trades, practices, procedures, techniques, tools and equipment, materials, specifications, quality control, cost control, and safety.

Proficient at the following tasks: stain-grade trim work, hang doors, drill and set door hardware, set windows, layout for stairs and common rafters, utilize appropriate math skills.

May possess some ability to read blueprints.

Possesses mathematical skills and analytical skills necessary to do material estimates. Has interpersonal and communications skills.

Has ability to understand verbal and written instructions.

Must know who to go to if problems or concerns arise, which would be the AB & JR Hodgkins project foreman, or project manager.

Organizational Skills

Able to organize assigned tasks, for completion alone or with help.

Problem Solving

Able to envision all steps in assigned tasks.

Has ability to envision corrective action for problem solving onsite.
